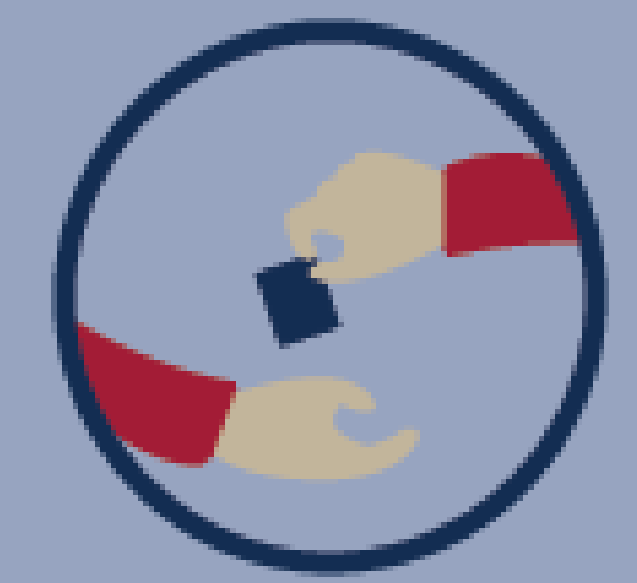
Access Health St Kilda

657 service contacts completed survey during February 2020 snapshot

495 service contacts completed survey during June 2020 snapshot

27% think drugs are **a little** harder to access

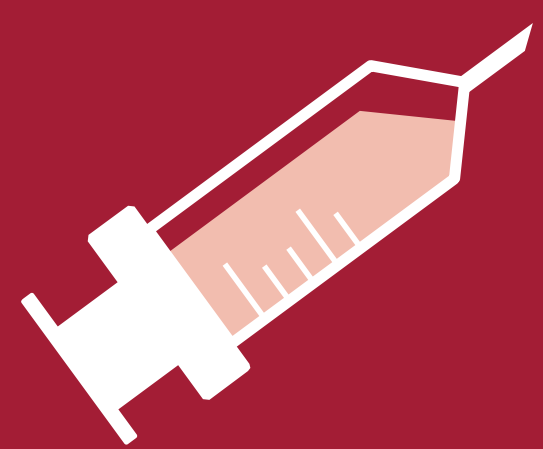
