Since Stage 4 COVID-19 restrictions began,

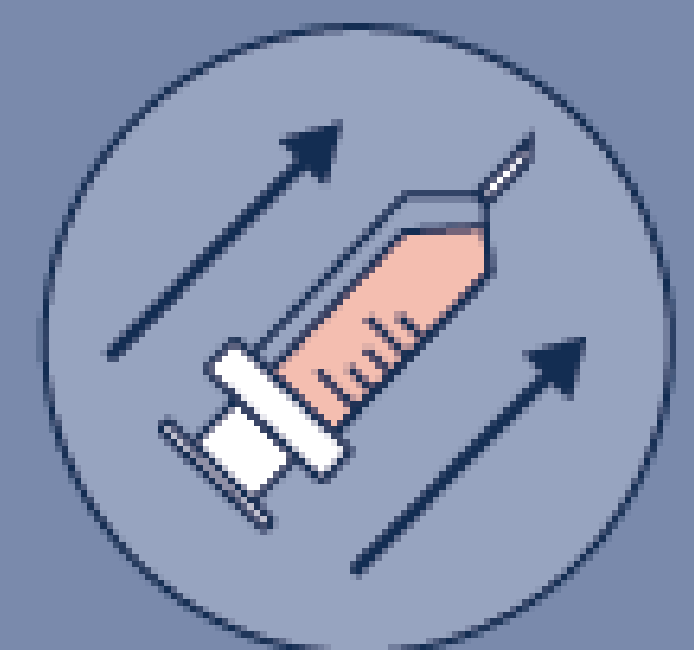
44% use decreased

18% use increased

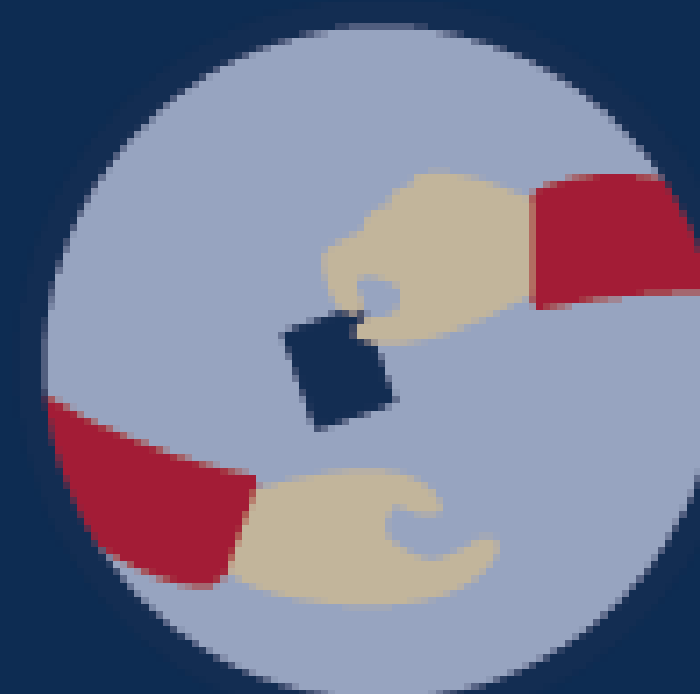
